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Dr. Natalia Wilson is an Adjunct Faculty Member at Arizona State University and Mayo Clinic School of Medicine. Dr. Wilson's education focus is the science of health care delivery and population health which she has taught in the College of Health Solutions at ASU, Mayo Clinic School of Medicine, and in ASU Executive Education. Her research area is unique device identification (UDI) system implementation and UDI use. Research projects have been funded by PCORI, AHRQ, and the U.S. FDA. Positions held at Arizona State University have included Clinical Associate Professor, Liaison for the ASU-Mayo Certificate Program in the Science of Health Care Delivery, Associate Director in the School for the Science of Health Care Delivery, Academic Program Director for Medical Studies, and Co-director of the Health Sector Supply Chain Research Consortium in the W. P. Carey School of Business. She was previously a physician partner in Thunderbird Internal Medicine where she focused on preventive care and women's health. Dr. Wilson received her MD from Georgetown University and trained in internal medicine at Vanderbilt University. She holds an MPH from The University of Arizona.
